Jesus, or if John was actually the one having doubts. The Old Testament people had doubts and Isaiah was able to make the promise of better times. John was in prison and Jesus didn't seem to be doing anything about the situation. Perhaps John wanted to see the fulfillment of the Prophecy (prisoners would be released.) Suffice it to say that Jesus pointed to Isaiah and showed Himself as the fulfillment of the prophecy of the One to come. Jesus said nice things about John but had better things to say about those who followed Him. We can without doubt believe in Him.

Hear us as we bring to You our private petitions. (Time of silent prayer.) Endow us with Your grace, that we daily show forth the Love of Christ, in Whom we pray.

THERE ARE MANY THEORIES TRYING TO EXPLAIN JOHN'S SENDING OF HIS DISCIPLES TO JESUS. Did John know he was to be executed, so he sent His disciples to join Jesus, or was John having doubts because Jesus (God) didn't seem interested in his predicament? If John did have doubts it certainly makes him as human as you and I. We struggle with our understanding of Jesus in the face of the whelming "evidence" presented by the world. The "evidence" presented by the Holy Spirit, (Who used the water and Word of our Baptism to make us over into His dwelling,) is greater. Jesus fulfilled the picture painted for us by the Old Testament Prophets. He looked exactly the way we expected. He is our Savior, the One we expected.

THEME OF THE DAY:

No Fear, No Doubt, Know Jesus

INTROIT—(Antiphon, Philippians 4:4;) Psalm 146:5-8

The last 5 Psalms are thought to be from the time of the rebuilding of the temple (so they may have been written by Ezra, Nehemiah, Haggai, or Zechariah.) This is the first liturgical use of Psalm 146 in our history. We make a proclamation of our joy in our God Who made all things for us. (Philippians 4, is covered below.)

COLLECT

We ask to be kept enlightened in the knowledge of Jesus as Savior.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON—Zephaniah 3:14-20

God's Word is for all people not only Israel. Zephaniah shows us how the Law serves the Gospel. God's Love in the Law serves God's Love for us in the Gospel. In our text Zephaniah was promising the eschatological kingdom of God. Your God is coming to dwell in the midst of the people in the world. He will come as a mighty warrior to save and to turn back the enemies. The world rejoices and the Lord Himself rejoices at the destruction of the enemies of His people. The God of wrath turns and becomes the God of mercy because of the sacrifice. When the king of Israel is with us we will have no fear. We will no longer fear God we will only know His Love.

GRADUAL—Zechariah 9:9; Psalm 118:26 alternative

Our knowledge of life centers on the return of our king, the Lord. We depend on the promise of His Second Advent. The Old Testament people put their trust in the prophecy of Zechariah, God counted up the days and fulfilled His promise. The Love of God overwhelmed the Old Testament people, the Love of God in the person of Jesus overwhelms us in joy.

EPISTLE LESSON—Philippians 4:4-7

God gives joy of mind and heart to His people in this life. Paul implored the Christians in Philippi to respond in faith and to experience that joy by engaging in prayer with thanksgiving. He encouraged them to give thanks in everything by prayer and petition offered to a gracious and loving God. Remembering and recounting all the things God has done for us gives us a renewed confidence in His extreme Love for us and all creatures of the Earth. It fills us with joy in all things. God's Love always leads us to know His joy in all things.

GOSPEL LESSON—Luke 7:18-35

John the Baptist introduced Jesus to all who would listen. John spoke wonderful words about the Savior, and Jesus in turn said wonderful things about John. It isn't clear if John sent his disciples to get them to follow
