### GOSPEL LESSON—John 2:13-25

We do not often have this picture of Christ. Whip in hand He overturned the tables, driving people and animals helter-skelter from the temple. He was claiming the Temple in His Father's name, rededicating it a house of prayer. Jesus pointed the people back to the fulfillment of the Law. He went much further turning the hearts of the people away from the thought that they could be saved by the keeping of the law, He turned them back to an expectation of salvation in the Messiah. God is a great and wonderful Father. He has given us the rules of life to make us more comfortable and more at home in this world. Following the "rules" enhances our relationship with God and our fellow humans. The "rules" do not make the relationship, the relationship leads us to love and respect.

THE CITY OF SAN JOSE USED PHOTO RADAR TO CATCH SPEEDERS. The residents of San Jose asked the police department to use the photo radar units in the expectation of slowing people down in their neighborhoods. Those caught speeding were quick to challenge the tickets. The basis of their challenge was that there was no authority, there was no law which allowed for the use of photo radar. No one challenged the fact that they were speeding, they simply challenged the idea that they could be ticketed by the use of a radar set up connected to a camera. No one disputed with Jesus that the money changers and animal sellers belonged in the temple. They disputed His authority to be the one to throw them out of the temple. The argument wasn't that they were wrong, only that He didn't have the right to tell them they were wrong. Don't be wrong, accept God's authority.

## THEME OF THE DAY:

A House of Prayer

## INTROIT—(Antiphon: Psalm 69:9;) Psalm 69:14-16

David was a type of Christ. Verse 9 of Psalm 69 is applied to Christ in the New Testament and is fulfilled in Jesus. King David was speaking of the spitefulness of his enemies. They criticized him for fasting and praying, and for singing songs with drunks. David's comfort was that he could go to God, Who is always there to help. Let my fears be prevented. Let me not fall into the gulf of despair. David found strength in calling to God. Jesus showed strength when He returned God's House to a place of prayer and praise. For doing the right thing He was criticized.

### COLLECT

We pray that those who have gone astray will return to the truth of God's Word. This prayer was added to our Propers in 2006 to more accurately reflect the theme of the Bible lessons.

### **OLD TESTAMENT LESSON**—Exodus 20:1-17

When we hear what God has declared and done for us, then it is clear that loving God is the only reason for following His will. We were redeemed from the spiritual bondage of our sinful life. God delivered us from that bondage through the death and Resurrection of His Son. God established the relationship of a Father and His children, that we might enjoy life in Him. As His children we love and respect our Father. In the love of that relationship as respectful children we follow His rules.

## **GRADUAL**—Hebrews 12:2

Hebrews chapter 12 compared the greater wonder of Heaven to our place here on Earth, and encourages us to look to Jesus (the Living Water) Who teaches us patience and perseverance.

## EPISTLE LESSON—1 Corinthians 1:18-31

The Jews and the Greeks rejected Christianity because of what they considered the foolishness of Christ's person and message. On the one hand, the claims of Christianity were considered easily dismissed because they could not be validated by proofs. The comfort in 1 Corinthians lies in the assurance that the substance and revelation of our faith are in and of God. The idea of the Son dying on a cross seems like weakness on God's part, (as if God couldn't save His own Son.) But it is really the massive strength of the Gospel of Salvation. From the cross we were given our strength, our purpose, our reason for endurance in this place of sin. In the death of Jesus we received eternal life.
