prominence, even in the one place they shouldn't have any prominence, in the outward structure and life of the church. This fact causes much distress to pious followers of Christ, and they may ask, as they hear this parable, "What should be our attitude towered the church of Christ, and what can be done about the scandals that afflict it?" Jesus comes to us offering liberty in the Word of God and the wonder of life in the kingdom of God. We hear and believe that God is sovereign that He has a plan. We may not always understand or comprehend that plan, but God is in control. We are a part of that plan. We are of the group that has been called out to be saved.

I HAVE DRIVEN THROUGH NEW YORK BUT HAVE NEVER SEEN THE STATUE OF LIBERTY. I drove down Manhattan Island, to no avail. The Statue was simply not visible from any of the places I went. We use a number of symbols to remind us of our liberty. We have the Statue, we have the flag, we have the Constitution, but what does it mean to live in this Republic? What is liberty? These are concepts, these are ideas, they are not something we see, they are something we experience. We use a number of symbols to remind us of the wonder of our salvation in Jesus Christ. An empty tomb and an empty cross, are the main symbols of our liberty in Christ. They are purposefully empty because the work of Jesus is finished. There isn't much to see with our eyes, and therefore we see liberty in Christ with our hearts, with our faith. Without seeing the Statue of Liberty, we know we live in freedom and liberty because of the words of the Constitution. Without seeing Jesus we know the work is over the battle is done our salvation has been won. It is all in the Word of Scripture.

THEME OF THE DAY:

Wheat and Weeds

INTROIT—(Antiphon: Psalm 86:6;) Psalm 86:11-15

Psalm 86 was written by David. Without light walking is difficult, we run the constant risk of falling down. Without being granted liberty by God, we can not listen to His Word. We proclaim the wonder that set us into liberty, cut us off from sin, and made us over to hear His Word of life and truth so that we are saved.

COLLECT

The Collect for three of the four Sundays of Advent begin with the words, "Stir up..." Dictionary.com says: "stir (verb) to move around, especially briskly; be active" We ask in Advent that God's power would be stirred up. We ask here that we would be stirred up to holiness that we would be allowed to dwell with Him forever. All this of course through the work and person of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON—Isaiah 44:6-8

The text derives from the second of the two main portions of Isaiah, commonly referred to as the "Book of Comfort" In this text God indeed comforts His people. God comforts Israel with the assurance of redemption, of new life through the Spirit, and of belonging to God. The wider context of Isaiah and of all Scripture makes clear that these blessings are ultimately given in the Messianic age. The fulfillment of the entire Old Testament is the call to liberty offered in the work and the Word of Jesus.

GRADUAL—Romans 11:33, 36

In Romans 11, Paul lamented the fact that the Jews rejected Jesus and therefore salvation. These verses sing praise to God for because of their unbelief, we were chosen to believe.

EPISTLE LESSON—Romans 8:18-27

The Spirit of God groans with all creation and mankind in our state of waiting for the completed fulfillment of Salvation. Even we Christian are not able to adequately diagnose our problems or articulate solutions for our own and the world's problems because of the brokenness resulting from the fall into sin. The Holy Spirit becomes our spokesman. He gets to the inner groans of our broken relationship. God hears the Holy Spirit pleading on our behalf and grants us the liberty to hear the Word, respond with repentance and receive the benefits of salvation in Jesus.

GOSPEL LESSON—Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

This is one of the parables about the realities of the Kingdom of Heaven. The wheat represents the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, who present themselves as having great power and
