foolish attempt to trap Him with a question, Jesus turned to the crowd and our Gospel Lesson began. It is interesting that Jesus states that the Pharisees and Scribes teach (most likely the Law) very well. However they do not, practice what they preach. As Paul also mentions, people tend to do things to be seen by others. Then Jesus launched into the importance of faith being an individual issue. We are saved by the depth of our faith, not from being the member of any particular group. Therefore there is One teacher to whom we should be dedicated and is Jesus, and we have One God to whom we are dedicated and He is our Father.

We ask You to bless all who trust in the merits of Jesus Christ for salvation. Have mercy on all who call on Your name this day. Bless our charitable efforts that Christ's name would be glorified. Forgive us our trespasses, support the weak, correct the disobedient and grant Your healing for all illness.

Hear us as we bring to You our private petitions. (Time of silent prayer.) May we realize Your presence among us as Your Love draws us ever closer to our heavenly home.

## THEME OF THE DAY:

Quietly Doing Good Works

# INTROIT—(Antiphon, Psalm 148:13;) Psalm 149:1-4

This is the only use of Psalm 148 in an Introit it was likely written by David and speaks of God the Creator. Psalm 149 was written by David when Jerusalem was taken and established as the City of God, it speaks of God as redeemer. We sing the new song of salvation in Jesus.

## **COLLECT**

In our prayer we ask to be, "stirred up," that is emotionally aroused to live our lives in holiness, here, that our bodies would be the place (the new Temple,) where our Christ will dwell.

## **OLD TESTAMENT LESSON**—Micah 3:5-12

The Holy Spirit inspired the Old Testament prophets to record promises of a Savior. False prophets popped up because they were compensated for agreeing with the kings or the people. God presents their lies, (which continue to be the lies of false prophets today.) Micah was allowed to restate his authority as a prophet, and to put out a warning against the faithlessness of the people. In the case of the Jerusalem, God gave the prophecy in verse 12, which was fulfilled twice, once in the time of Jeremiah and then the final destruction in AD 70.

## **GRADUAL**—Revelation 7:14b; Psalm 84:5

Those who have come out of the tribulation of this world are those who have been given faith. These people praise God for all they have been given. Revelation 7 tells us the number of the saved. As such it is of great encouragement. Psalm 84, by the Sons of Korah was written for worship. Our faith is the highway that has been laid out in our heart to take us to Heaven.

## **EPISTLE LESSON**—1 Thessalonians 4:1-12

It is possible to speak of sin as a category and to speak of specific sins. Paul does both in this section. In the first 4 chapters he was speaking to everyone in the final two chapters he was speaking to the leaders. In the first, "sexual immorality," includes being in control of your own mind. The world likes to speak in terms of victims. Sin is okay as long as it doesn't involve anyone else. Paul was saying that lust in your mind is hurting your sanctification. He went on to "brotherly love." Often people do good to others so that it will noticed. Paul told us to do our good works quietly, keep it to yourself, and live from the work of your own hands.
