pop up ever day. Even with the benefit of the Scriptures, preachers on the various forms of media spend their days telling us that if we send them money it will be blessed by God, or that they are the true religion, even though they do not teach Christ crucified. We are not so unlike the people at the time of Jesus. He was confronted with lies and deceptions even told about the Messiah. His solution; prayer. Pray in all truth and humility that God would find the true shepherds and send them out among the people with the beautiful message of salvation through Jesus. (I never know quite what to say about chapter 10 verse 4. The fact that Judas, one of the chosen Twelve, betrayed Jesus, is difficult to ponder.)

P O God, King Eternal, You are our light and salvation our portion with the living. We, Your children, seek You now in prayer, and plead with You to rest Your hand of benediction on our soul.

WATCHING JESUS AT WORK IN THE WORLD IS A CONSTANT SOURCE OF WONDER AND DELIGHT. Jesus calls the sinners of the world to "repent for the kingdom is at hand." In His humanity, the preacher Jesus, tells us to pray to God to ensure that there are sufficient called and ordained ministers of the Gospel, to fulfill the needs of the people of the world. There are many men among us who recognize the call of God in their lives. Pray that God would send them to the harvest fields.

THEME OF THE DAY:

Pray For Faithful Pastors

INTROIT—(Antiphon, Psalm 67:3;) Psalm 67:4-7

We use all but the first two verses of this Psalm in our worship today. ("¹May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us, ²that your way may be known on Earth, your saving power among all nations.") Martin Luther used those verses in the hymn, "May God bestow on us His grace." (823) This unattributed Psalm is a prayer which encourages the people of the world to believe in God (which is a bound up in the fact that we send out missionaries) because our God is great and gracious with the abundance of the harvest.

COLLECT

We praise God for the fact that we have heard God's saving Word as He sent it into the world and we ask that we are allowed to believe.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON—Exodus 19:2-8

In Exodus 19 God was preparing the people to receive His Law. For the most part God was preparing them for the 10 Commandments, while chapters 21, 22 and 23 have multiple other laws as laid out by God. It is almost comical that the people respond to the preparation with, "All that the Lord has spoken we will do." The chapters preceding are rife with the complaints of the people against God, and we learn in the book of Deuteronomy that the generation that left Egypt would not be allowed to enter the promised land because of their sin. Still, God accepts their pledge and gives them His Holy Law.

GRADUAL—Psalm 145:3, 5b, 6b

In Psalm 145, David, encourages us to praise God. We have chosen, with these verses, to praise Him for His greatness.

EPISTLE LESSON—Romans 5:6-15

This text is about two totally different men. One might say there is a villain and a hero. Adam sinned and introduced sin to the entire human race. Jesus came into the world to conquer sin and to declare the sinful descendants of the Adam righteous. In baseball the "error" of one player can lose the game for the entire team. In our case, the error of one lost our perfection. Jesus assumed the burden of sin for the entire world. He picked up the errors of the entire world and paid the price for that sin. Jesus made it right with God so that we are no longer seen as the son of Adam, but the son of God.

GOSPEL LESSON—Matthew 9:35-10:20
